The Department of Health (DOH), Solid Waste Section acknowledges receipt of your solid waste management permit by rule application on October 24, 2011, requesting a renewal with no modification on solid waste management permit by rule for the subject facility. Your application was dated October 20, 2011 and the package included an application form, Attachments P-5 (including a letter dated October 20, 2011 from the City and County of Honolulu, Department of Planning and Permitting) and P-6, and application filing fee of \$25.00. An *Operations Plan* and site maps were dated November 2011 and received on November 30, 2011. A *Health and Safety Plan* dated November 2011 and a site layout were received on December 1, 2011 via email.

In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 58.1, Solid Waste Management Control, of the Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), approval is granted to EnviroServices & Training Center, LLC to perform one day household hazardous waste (HHW) collections up to six (6) times per year at the subject site if the conditions in HAR §11-58.1-04(i) are met. Under this permit, the facility may only accept HHW, and may only receive less than forty (40) tons per day of waste during the collection event. The permit expires November 17, 2016.

Enclosed please find a receipt for the filing fee and a copy of the *Permit by Rule for Certain Solid Waste Handling and Disposal Facilities of Limited Impact*. Permit by rule allows a facility to operate under the conditions stated in the rules. EnviroServices & Training Center, LLC, as permittee, must comply with the permit by rule conditions listed under items A, B, C,

and D of the enclosed document, and additional conditions as specified below, in accordance with HAR §11-58.1-04(i)(1)(B)(iv).

Additional Permit Conditions:

1. The facility may only accept, sort, package and temporarily store HHW.
2. A screening program with record keeping shall be performed at the entrance to ensure that only HHW enters the facility. This record shall be available onsite for inspection by the DOH.
3. The operations shall be consistent with the permit application, "Operations Plan-Oahu Household Hazardous Waste Collection and Disposal" and "Health and Safety Plan - Oahu Household Hazardous Waste Collection and Disposal," dated November 2011 and prepared by EnviroServices & Training Center, and any approved subsequent submissions. HHW collections may be conducted every other month, which is up to six (6) times per year. Should there be any discrepancies between the submitted materials and permit conditions, the permit conditions shall take precedence. Any changes and modifications shall be submitted for review and approved by the DOH prior to the activity.
4. The "Operations Plan" and the "Health and Safety Plan" dated November 2011 and permit conditions shall be kept at the site and adhered to by operations personnel.
5. The permittee shall provide signage, dedicated personnel, and related equipment/supplies (i.e. traffic cones) to properly direct vehicles arriving/leaving the receiving area on collection days. The permittee shall direct incoming vehicles in a manner so that there is sufficient room for through traffic. The permittee shall have a plan to prevent the incoming vehicle waiting line (queue) from backing up onto Waihona Street.
6. The accepted materials shall be packaged, stored, and prepared for shipment in accordance with all local, state, and federal regulations before creating a nuisance or a health, safety, or environmental hazard. The HHW may be stored at the site for not more than thirty (30) days, provided that the storage does not pose risks to human health and the environment.
7. Adequate measures, including containment systems, shall be prepared to control the scattering and spills/releases of collected materials. Any spills/releases shall be immediately contained and remediated. Releases exceeding reportable quantities under HAR 11-451 shall be reported to the Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office. Should a release occur, the site shall be secured until the remedial activities are concluded.

8. All collected material shall only be transported to an appropriate DOH-permitted facility, or out-of-state government approved treatment, storage, and disposal facility (TSDF).
9. The facility shall be supervised, secured by gates, fences, or other measures to control access to the facility. The permittee shall provide a way for emergency personnel (i.e. fire department) to gain access in an emergency situation.
10. Scavenging at the facility by the general public is prohibited.
11. Suitable means shall be employed to control visual and odor nuisances. Waste generated (such as packaging and trash material) from the HHW collection should be disposed in accordance with applicable regulations.
12. Records must be kept of incoming and outgoing HHW for a minimum of five (5) years. Information should include, but is not limited to, source and type of material received, date and quantity received, length of time of material stored, final destination of waste, and disposal and/or transaction receipts. Copies shall be made available to the DOH upon request.
13. The permittee shall notify the DOH of its proposed collection days. Upon the completion of the one day of HHW collection, closure of the site shall commence. Closure shall consist of the removal and any remediation of the site as necessary.
14. The permittee shall submit a post-collection summary report to the DOH within forty-five (45) days of the collection event. The summary report shall include the following information:
  - a. Type of solid waste received.
  - b. Quantities by weight (an estimate in gross of tons, volumes, or quantity count, as appropriate, is sufficient) of solid waste received by type, and final destination of the waste (including name of DOH permitted facility/out-of-state TSDF, and copies of disposal receipts and/or associated manifests).
  - c. Information regarding any releases, such as type of release, quantity of release, and release response activities.
15. Should the permittee choose to operate a facility after the expiration date, the permittee shall submit a permit renewal application at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration date. The application for a renewal permit shall contain an operations narrative, site plan, zoning clearance form, property owner approval form, and application filing fee.

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16. An annual report shall be prepared and submitted to the DOH, reporting the total amounts (by weight) of HHW materials received, and the location(s) distributed. The report is due on July 31, of each year for the preceding fiscal year. Reports shall be submitted to:

The permittee may appeal to the Director of Health any of the conditions to the subject permit. The appeal must be in writing and submitted within twenty (20) days after the receipt of this notice.

Hawaii Revised Statutes 342H-14 states that unless the submitted documents and other information secured by the DOH from the permittee contain confidential information, such as secret processes or methods of manufacture, they shall be made available for inspection by the public. Please notify the Solid and Hazardous Waste Branch within twenty (20) days of the receipt of this letter if you would like to make a claim of confidentiality. Otherwise, your entire application will be available for public inspection.
